Your Step-by-step Guide to Studying at Slough & Langley

Step 1: Choose Your Course

We offer a wide range of courses at all levels – if you're still not sure, give us a call on 01753 793288 or email admissions@windsor-forest. ac.uk for independent advice.

Step 2: Apply

Apply online at https://www.langley.ac.uk/ study/. You shall receive an email to confirm we have received your application.

Step 3: Attend Your Interview

You will be invited to book an interview, where you will discuss your course choice and plans for the future. This will also give you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have too.

Step 4: Offer

Following a successful interview, you shall be made a conditional offer via email.

Please note: This can take up to 14 days. To accept your conditional offer, please log back into your Student Portal. You need to accept your offer to receive your invitation to enrolment.

Step 5: Enrol

You shall be sent steps on how to enrol onto your chosen course the Summer before you start with us and you will need your exam results to be able to enrol in August. If your results are better than expected or you didn't do as well as you hoped, please do not worry, we can find a suitable alternative for you.

Step 6: Start College

Study Programme

Our study programmes combine your chosen subject with a range of transferable skills to enhance your learning and help you develop. We will equip you with the skills and knowledge required for progression on to university, apprenticeships or employment.

English & maths

You will be enrolled onto a GCSE course and will work towards gaining a grade 4 or above as part of your study programme.

Achieved Lower Than a Grade 3 at GCSE?

You will be enrolled onto a GCSE course or another appropriate English and/or maths qualification at an appropriate level.

Practical Lessons, Lectures & Tutorials

These planned activities take place on our extensive campus and will help you develop your independent study skills. You will focus on extending your practical skills and knowledge to gain a strong understanding of your chosen subject area.

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

T Levels are qualifications for students aged 16 to 19 living in England who have finished their GCSEs.

Each T Level is equivalent to 3 A levels and helps you to develop the knowledge and practical skills to enter the workplace or progress onto further study.

T Levels offer you more practical work experience and industry placement hours as part of your education than any other qualification currently available, except for apprenticeships.

T Levels, A Levels, and Apprenticeships have key differences in terms of their focus and structure.

- **T Levels** are designed to prepare learners for skilled professions or further study. They consist of 80% classroom-based learning and 20% industry placement, providing practical work experience. T Levels are equivalent to 3 A Levels and offer a broad understanding of sector-specific issues and occupational specialisms.
- Apprenticeships are for individuals who want to learn a specific occupation. They involve 80% on-the-job training and 20% classroom-based learning. Apprenticeships are suitable for those who have a clear career path, are at least 16 years old, and want to earn a wage while learning.
- A Levels are focused on academic education and are typically chosen by learners who want to continue their academic studies.

These distinctions highlight the varying emphasis on practical skills, industry experience, and academic education in each pathway.

Are T Levels included in the UCAS tariff?

UCAS tariff points are allocated to T Levels in the same way they are with A Levels.

UCAS points are only allocated to the **overall T Level grade**. Students must achieve at least an overall pass grade to receive UCAS points.

This **11 week part-time course** requires an Entry Level 3 or above for literacy.

All learners will need to complete an initial assessment in order to identify their learning level and any needs.

Please note: The course will be delivered over 11 weeks, one day a week. There will be a range of teaching methods including practical workshops, set tasks and workbooks.

Level 2 Programme in Supporting Teaching & Learning

This 1 year part-time course

requires a Level 1 or above for literacy. A Disclosure Barring Service check is also required.

Level 3 Programme in Supporting Teaching & Learning

This **1 year part-time course** requires students to have or be prepared to gain a Level 2 in English and maths.

A Disclosure Barring Service check is also required.

Please note: You will be required to attend College and a practical placement once a week for the duration of the course. The placement coordinator will support learners in locating a suitable placement for the course. Learners must be supporting in a year 1 class or higher.

Level 2 Programme for Early Years Practitioner

This 1 year full-time course

requires GCSE grade 3 in maths and English or Functional skills Level 1 maths and English. A Disclosure Barring Service check is required.

Level 3 Programme for the Early Years Workforce

This **18 months part-time course** requires Level 2 equivalent maths and English gualifications.

- GCSE English and GCSE /International GCSE qualification in English language and / or literature to at least grade C (grade 4) and maths to at least grade C (grade 4)
- Functional skills qualification in English and maths at Level 2

Learners will need suitable Level 2 English and maths qualifications on completion to be considered a full Level 3 and be included as such in the EYFS staff: child ratios.

A Disclosure Barring Service check is required.

Level 3 Programme in Supporting Teaching and Learning (workbased learning)

12-18 months

Learners must be supporting pupils in key stage one or higher and ideally have or be prepared to gain a minimum of Level 2 in maths and English.

Please note: For all pre-access to HE courses, students must demonstrate enthusiasm and a commitment to the course.

Students would ideally have some work experience in a heath and social care setting, but this is not essential. However some voluntary work or a part-time position is recommended, prior to applying.

Level 3 Access to HE Nursing & Health Professions

This **1 year course** requires either GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English and maths or functional skills at Level 2.

Level 3 Access to HE Social Sciences & Education

This **1 year course** requires either GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English and maths or functional skills at Level 2.

Level 3 Access to HE Social Work & Mental Health Professions

This **1 year course** requires GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English and maths.

For nursing and social work, students can be accepted at university with Level 2 functional skills qualifications instead of GCSEs.

Please note: For all access to HE courses, students may be asked to complete an initial diagnostic assessment. It may be possible to complete a maths course alongside the Access course. Very good IT skills are also required to complete and submit work.

What is an Apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a job with training to industry standards. An apprentice is a paid employee who is training on the job and involved in an educational programme.

The apprentice gains the skills, knowledge and behaviours that they need to forge their career. This programme supports businesses to train the future workforce. An apprentice could be someone new to the industry or could be an existing member of staff.

As an Apprentice You Will

- Work alongside experienced staff
- Earn a wage and get holiday pay
- Gain job-specific skills
- Get time for study related to your role

You are required to stay in education, employment or training until you turn 18 but this can include being an apprentice. Apprenticeships have a functional skills requirement in English and maths but learners who already have obtained the level required will be exempt from undertaking them. An apprenticeship is a real job where you will be employed full-time for the duration of your qualification. Apprenticeships also include an end-point assessment. It's an assessment at the end of your apprenticeship to make sure you're fully competent in your specific occupation.
